## PSC MISSION & FEES

- We offer individual, couple, family and group counseling for children and adults at a minimal cost.
- We work with clients from diverse demographic and socio-economic groups as well as multi-cultural backgrounds.
- We use a sliding fee scale, which starts at just \$5 per session with a one-time intake fee of \$40. The charge for a comprehensive psychological assessment is only \$600.

## SERVICES

### Psychological Assessment and Testing

## OUR LOCATION

We are located in Lodge A on the campus of LIU Post in Brookville, New York.

### DIRECTIONS BY CAR

From Points West: Take the LIE (I-495) east to Exit 39 and make a left at the light (Glen Cove Road north). Go north for 2 miles; turn right (east) on Northern Blvd. (Route 25A). LIU Post is 2 miles on the right. Enter at the east entrance (2nd entrance). Proceed straight. Lodge A is on your left.

**From Points East:** Take the LIE (I-495) to exit 41N (Route 107). Turn right (north) onto 107 north. Proceed to Northern Blvd. (Route 25A). Turn left (west) at Northern Blvd. LIU Post is on your left. Enter at the east entrance (1st entrance). Proceed straight. Lodge A is on your left.
